**CORE Questions**

**Read Acts 25**

1. **In this passage, Paul once again faces false accusations and political pressure, yet he calmly appeals to Caesar rather than trying to manipulate the situation.** What stands out to you about the way Paul handles injustice and opposition? What does his response teach us about trusting God when circumstances feel unfair or out of our control?
2. **Festus and Agrippa both recognize that Paul has done nothing deserving punishment, yet the political system still keeps him bound.** What does this reveal about the difference between human justice and God's purposes? Can you think of times when God used difficult or unjust circumstances to accomplish something greater?
3. **Even though Paul is a prisoner, his situation creates an opportunity for the gospel to be heard by governors and kings.** How might God use difficult seasons, limitations, or opposition in our lives as opportunities for His mission? Where might you need to shift your perspective right now?

**Family Question:** *(Kid-friendly)*

**Paul trusted God even when he was treated unfairly.** When something unfair happens to you, what is one way you can respond in a way that honors God?
